The <u>vaccine passport</u> will be required for people aged 13 and over for the use of the ski lifts and the access of certain services in the ski lodge. Be ready to show your vaccine passport and your photo ID at your arrival at the ski area.

Ski lodge		The face covering is mandatory inside the ski lodge for people aged 10 and over. The venue capacity is based on its surface area and ability to respect the 1 meter physical distancing between people who do not live together. Depending on the configuration of the lodge, the vaccine passport may be mandatory to access the lodge, since it is required for restaurants, cafeterias, bars and lunch areas.
Restaurants, bars and lunch areas		The face covering is mandatory, except when seated at the table. Maximum of 10 people per table or occupants of 3 residences. Indoor, a distance of 1 meter must be respected between tables that do not have a protective division.
Services (ski shop, rentals, lockers)		The face covering is mandatory in the indoor spaces for people aged 10 and over. The venue capacity is based on its surface area and ability to respect the 1 meter physical distancing between people who do not live together.
Ski lifts		Visitors from the same household are encouraged to ride the lift together. In the lift lines and while riding the lift, the face-covering* is recommended. Inside the gondolas, the face covering* is mandatory. *It can be a balaclava or neck warmer covering both mouth and nose.
Skiing and snowboarding schools and racing clubs		Ski and snowboard lessons as well as racing club activities are permitted. The face covering* is recommended. *It can be a balaclava or neck warmer covering both mouth and nose.
